Association honors Distinguished Alumni Tom Raisor, Ruth Chin, Ida Husted Harper

The Muncie Central High School Alumni Association recognized three distinguished Central graduates at the 2021 annual meeting in November 2021.

Thomas L. Raisor, '53, was acknowledged for his long-time service to the community of Muncie and the MCHS Alumni Association.

Ruth Chin, '42, and Ida Husted Harper, in the school's first graduating class in 1868, were honored posthumously for their distinguished lifetime achievements.

Raisor is the the first alumnus to become a second-generation recipient. His father, Floyd Raiser, '28, was named a distinguished alumnus in 2003.

Raisor was a member of the 1951 and 1952 championship basketball teams. He went on to play basketball at the University of Michigan from which he earned his undergraduate degree. He then earned a law degree from Indiana University.

He chose to return to Muncie to open his law practice after serving in the U.S. Army and after declining an offer to join a law firm in New York. Serving clients until he retired in 2018, he also was a Muncie city judge for eight years.

Throughout the years and before his retirement from his law practice, Raisor was involved with the Delaware County Chamber of Commerce and the Kiwanis Club. He also has been an active member of High Street United Methodist Church.

Raisor and his family have owned season tickets for Bearcat basketball games for years. A dedicated volunteer with the Alumni Association's Memorabilia Room located in the Muncie Fieldhouse, Raisor is an emeritus member of the Alumni Association board of directors.

Chin became the first female photographer for *The Muncie Star* and *Muncie Evening Press* and the first Chinese-American photojournalist in Indiana. In 1951, Chin was the first female photographer to win the Bushemi

Award, Indiana's top photography award given by The Associated Press.

As a photographer for the Muncie newspapers, she also became the first female photographer to cover an Indiana High School State Basketball Championship in Hinkle Fieldhouse. She was inducted into the Indiana Journalism Hall of Fame in 2014.

Chin passed away in Muncie October 1, 2021.

Harper was a suffragist, journalist, and author until her death in 1931. She was a friend and activist with the nation's best-known suffragist, Susan B. Anthony.

Harper's use of her journalistic skills to educate other journalists, the public, and politicians about the need for women to have the right to vote played a key role in persuading the U.S. Congress to pass the 19th Amendment, which gave women the right to vote. Among Harper's most enduring contributions are the three biographical volumes she wrote with Anthony titled *The Life and Work of Susan B. Anthony*.

Past mascots take center court to celebrate 'Cat history

February 11 was a night to celebrate. And celebrate, they did!

In honor of the Bearcat nickname and use of an official mascot, alumni who had donned the mascot uniform through the decades were on hand to be recognized during halftime of the varsity basketball game.

Besides acknowledging that the Bearcat nickname and use of a mascot is considered one of the oldest in the state, the celebration also showed off the newest "suit of clothes" for the mascot, currently dubbed "Beau".

The custom-made outfit was tailored like previous ones, and the head likeness was based on the Bearcat face on the gym floor.

Cost of the uniform was about \$5,000 and was funded by contributions from individuals and groups. According to Charles Reynolds, associate superintendent of Muncie Community Schools, there were 10 individual or "grouped" contributions, meaning a single donation listing several names. The Muncie Central Alumni Association and a local foundation grant were among the contributors.

The new mascot debuted during the class of 2021 senior parade and made its initial athletic appearance at the first home football game August 20, 2021, vs. Delta.

Willard Duffy, '33, was a state champion wrestler. He went with the Olympic team to Berlin, Germany in 1936 as an alternate.

In 1903, there was an organized girl's basketball program.

Gentry also paid tribute to more recent alumni, ranging from swimmer Lizzi Smith, '14, paralympic gold, silver, and bronze medalist and 2013 world champion, to Ryan Kerrigan, '07, still active in the National Football League.

25 years since inception, Association mission continues

The Muncie Central Alumni Association awards an annual \$2,000 scholarship to a college-bound student, offers grants totaling an additional \$2,000 to Central teachers, and identifies other opportunities to provide items that enhance the school as a whole. Both programs were initiated in 1998.

An additional endowed scholarship, established by Sherry Harris Jones, '62, and her husband, Ralph, currently provides a \$5,000 scholarship annually.

A visible point of pride is the Alumni Association's Memorabilia Room, housed in the southeast corner of the Muncie Fieldhouse.

Started with a few trophies that were spared in 2004 from storage at the school, the Memorabilia Room now has more than 6,000 items in its collection. Many are on display and include the original state championship banners that hung in the fieldhouse. The Alumni Association contributed to the purchase of new banners to replace the fading ones.

At the school the Association has answered the call to monetarily help projects come to fruition. Examples include contributing to the purchase of laundry equipment housed in the school to assist students in need and providing funding for individual performance outfits and uniforms for students as identified by school personnel.

How We Started

Bernard Freund, '29, had a dream. A devout Muncie High School graduate, he was driven by a desire to see Muncie Central form an organization that could connect alumni to one another as well as provide resources to the school and current students. He envisioned a group that, ultimately, could host reunions and would encompass all class years.

Freund had observed, first-hand, such an organziation. His wife was a member of her Fort Wayne North Side High School's alumni organization.

He diligently collected names and contact information of the organizers for each class reunion as it appeared in the newspaper. Armed with an extensive list, he approached Principal Joe Kinnett, '58, with his idea.

And, so it was, in 1995 the roots were planted. Kinnett called together Freund and two 1964 graduates, Linda Hollis and Charlotte Shepperd, to talk. Hollis was teaching at Central at the time. Shepperd had taught at Central but had since joined the Ball State University Almni Association staff.

Using Freund's contact list, core plans were established. Phone banks, letters, and personal contacts provided the grass roots for the organization we know today.

Jones excelled in football in high school and college. On a Bearcat football team that won the sectional, Jones was also part of a Ball State Cardinal team that had a 12-0 record

Jones also was a member of the Bearcat basketball team during his time at Central.

McCarville, who began playing volleyball as a sixth-grader, was a member of the Bearcat varsity squad as a freshman in 1998. That year, the Bearcats won a state title and returned for a second state championship in 1999. They were runners-up in 2000.

McCarville played in the Indiana All-Star game after her junior and senior seasons. She continued playing in college for Southeast Missouri State.

Young was one of Delaware County's top sprinters in track and field during his high school career.

He earned three medals at the IHSAA state meet during his career and established two school records as a senior.

After his senior season, Young was named to the Midwest Meet of Champions.

Looking ahead toward this spring's senior activities, two events are of particular importance. The Class of 2022 senior awards program will be Tuesday, May 24 at 6:30 p.m. in the MCHS auditorium.

Commecement is set for Worthen Arena on Ball State's campus, Monday, June 6, at 7:30 p.m. Doors will open one hour ahead.

If past is prologue, the school website offers information regarding its 2021 graduating class: 91 students earned a cumulative GPA of 3.0 and above; nearly \$6,000,000 in total scholarship offers were awarded; 175 students obtained a Core 40 and above; MCS had one of two 2021 Delaware County Lilly Endowment Community scholars.

Samuel Voss, '21, Central's recipient, was a four-sport athlete for the Bearcats. During his time in high school, he co-founded Dressember, a fundraiser and awareness program for human trafficking.

The Lilly is awarded to students with leadership potential and who are community-minded. The four-year scholarship grants full tuition to any accredited public or private non-profit college or university in Indiana.

Richard Conaway, '61, died July 20, 2021, in Muncie.

A multi-sport athlete, he excelled in football, wrestlig, and track at Central and was state heavyweight wrestling champion his senior year. He was also named to the all-state football team.

Conaway attended Indiana University, where he was an All-American wrestler. After receiving his bachelor's degree from IU, he obtaind his master's degree from Purdue University.

He taught chemistry at Muncie Central and was both a football and wrestling coach for the Bearcats, and later at Delta.
